

## Myesha Wilson

Executive Director of Olive Crest (Strong Families, Safe Kids)

Olive Crest is a non-profit organization aimed at transforming the lives of at-risk children through the healing power of family. True to its mission, the organization's name means "peaceful family". Myesha Wilson, the Executive Director of Olive Crest, says this focus on family is what drew her to the "non-profit. "It's different when an organization is run by a husband and wife who started it

40 years ago," she said. "Everyone has a deep compassion for youth and family.

According to Wilson, there are nearly two million adopted children in the United States. An estimated 135,000 boys and girls will be added to that total this year, with many of them in the Las Vegas area. "That's one child adopted every four minutes."

Founded in 1973, the organization is both family-driven and faith-based, as it promotes the teachings of Judeo-Christian principles while respecting every individual's religious back ground.

Olive Crest provides a wide range of services, from case management and social services to transportation assistance and healthcare referrals. It also offers basic necessities such as food, clothing, hygiene products, and infant care packages. Many programs are offered as well, such as Strong Families, foster care, respite care, and various mental health services.

The non-profit's youth-driven programs, such as Operation Independence, work with current and former foster youth between the ages of 16 and 24. The program helps foster youth find positions in the job market. Since every youth has different needs an intake assessment is completed to help determine what services are best suited for each individual.

One of the major issues Olive Crest is paying close attention to is the rate of graduation for foster children. In 2017, only 50 foster youth graduated from schools in the Clark County district. In 2018, 110 foster youth are expected to graduate.

Unfortunately, Las Vegas is ranked fourth in the nation for youth homelessness, but Wilson says Olive Crest – with the help of other similar organizations have the ability to change that. "We believe in collaboration with local business and other non-profit organizations," she says.


With funding from the goverment and private institutions, Wilson stands by her conviction that Olive Crest and Las Vegas' various non-profit organizations can put an end to youth homelessness and unemployment.

Olive Crest has offices in California's Orange County, Los Angeles, the Inland and Desert Communities, San Diego, Las Vegas, and much of the Pacific Northwest.

## CARING FOR YOURSELF WHILE TAKING CARE OF FOSTER CHILDREN

For the first time in about nine months, I was able to get outside and do some work in the yard. I have been a lifelong gardener, and I often found refuge while gardening; time for myself to reflect, think, and relax. Of late, I had neglected my gardening chores, due in large part to having nine children in the home. I was not making time for the garden, and thus not taking time for myself. As a result, I was becoming worn out, exhausted, and was approaching a burn out that I did not want or need.

As I tackled the job of pruning back the many butterfly bushing my yard, I felt the stresses and tension that had been in my shoulders the past months quickly slip away. Indeed, it had been a difficult time the past six months, with a house full of children. The latest children in foster care in our home had come with a variety of challenges and needs that were all too demanding of my wife and me. We had both grieved when the

two youngest foster children were placed into another home; a home with no children and where the foster parents could completely focus on their many needs. With nine children in our home, my wife and I were spending all our time trying to meet the needs of these two, while almost ignoring the other seven. Perhaps it was best for all if these two were placed into another home; a home that could give them all the support and resources they needed. The oldest foster child stayed with us; a decision that the courts, the case workers, and the teen all felt was best, and one that we so very wanted, as well.

Pruning back the branches and Spent flowers from the previous season, I allowed myself the first opportunity in a long time to take some time for myself, doing something I enjoyed. I needed this time alone, and I could tell right away that I would be better for it, and my family would benefit from it, as well. In an almost humorous light, I laughed to my-

self, thinking that seven children seemed much easier than nine. Foster parents certainly have a different perspective of things in life.

Without a doubt, foster parenting is hard work! It may just be the hardest work you ever do. You will often find yourself exhausted, both mentally and physically, and feel drained. There is very little money available to help you, and you will not be reimbursed for all the money you spend on your foster child.

The job will require you to work 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with no time off. You will probably feel overworked and unappreciated. You will work with children who are most likely coming from difficult and harmful environments. Some of these children will have health issues, some will come with behavioral issues, and some will struggle with learning disabilities. Many times, the children you work with will try your patience, and leave you with headaches, frustrations, disappointments, and even heartbreaks. There is a reason why many people are not foster parents, as it is often too difficult. The turnover rate for foster parents in the United States is between 30% and each year.

I know of some people that become so engrossed in being a parent and taking care of children that their own personal identity disappears over time. Don't neglect who you are and what makes you special. After all, your spouse fell in love with you for who you are! When foster parenting becomes too stressful, you, your family, and your foster child will all feel the effects. Thus,

one of the most important reminders for you, as a foster parent, is the fact that you need to take care of yourself, physically, mentally and emotionally. If you neglect yourself, your family will suffer as a result. Finding time for you will not be easy, but it's very essential. Make time to do something you enjoy, and that you find relaxing.

Spend time with some friends, perhaps over lunch or dinner. Do not neglect your own personal health; make sure you get plenty of exercise regularly and eat healthy. If you take time for yourself, you will help to ensure your well being, as you care for others in your own home.


Dear Juan, it's ok. Just remember that this too will pass. Most children are very active. Be patient, 20 years from now you will be laughing over these good old days.



The CWLA is a national member-based organization founded nearly 100 years ago. The organization came during or around Teddy Roosevelt creation of the children's bureau for the well-being of children. We lead and engage our network of public and private agencies and partners to advance policy, best practices and strategies for better outcomes for children and youth and families that are vulnerable. The organization share news policies about range of services, and provides training, counseling and support for child welfare agencies.

We have a set of standards and trainings that non-profits can rely on them depending on what specific programs are need. Assist with practices that can lead to accreditation standards for federal level that will influence their policies member are non-profits, county government, child welfare agencies conduct range of services in foster care placements, residential providers, and adoptions support services.

Members can receive consultations to access to best practices, technical voice. There are annually fees associated and limited single membership levels.

Most organizations are concerned about the best interest of children, we understand that the few are better and permanency is important. Advocate for moving placement if it promotes permanency; however prevention of removal is ideal. About 20,000 youth age out of the system each year, we would like to see a decrease in the numbers. It is a challenge that we are trying to address that these youth have access to affordable care act and other services.

CWLA has assisted with the impact on changes that have been made. Kinship care has been a more effective policy to assist permanency in youth. Legislation packages in the past, fostering connections act and several others. It is never too late to be adopted. Encourage young people not to give up on being adopted even after 18 or 21, it creates a system and network of support.

In April we hosted our national conference in Washington, DC. Open to anyone. Training sessions, CEUS for social workers, policy workshops, opportunity to go to Capitol Hill and have your voice heard. Youth are invited to attend to voice their opinions and attend workshops.






